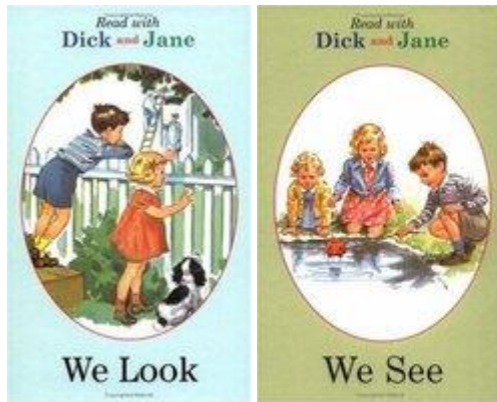


## Where to Start

Learning how to read is such a huge step. Where do you start?



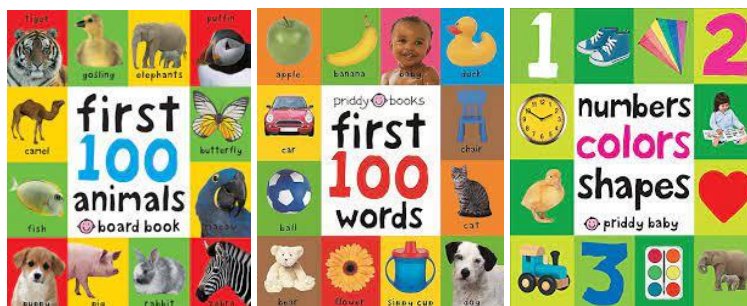

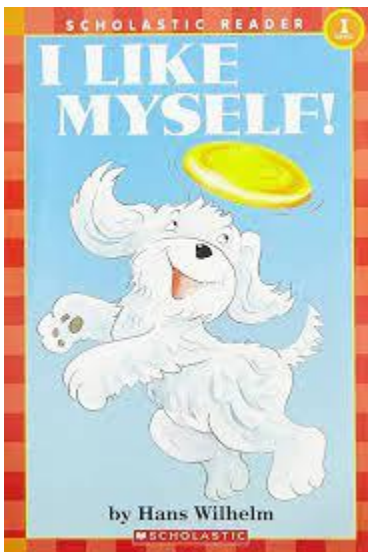


Leap Frog Books

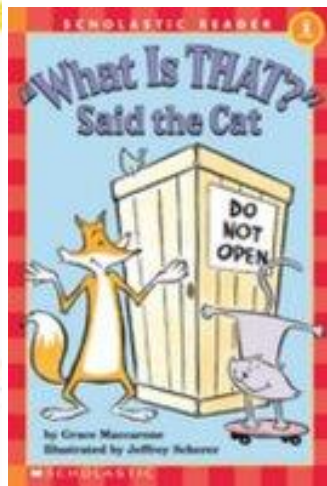
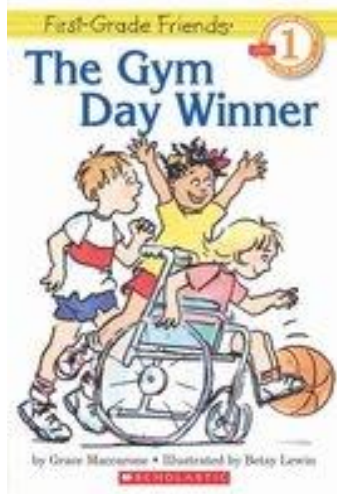
These books under LEA in our early reader section are great when it comes to introducing certain vowel sounds to kids. For example: short vowels, short i, short a, short u

For this next step, check out the books that say that they are **Level 1**. Not all are created equal, but this is still a good rule to start with!

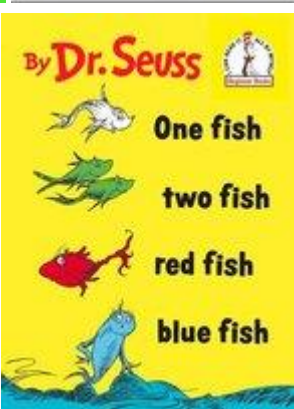
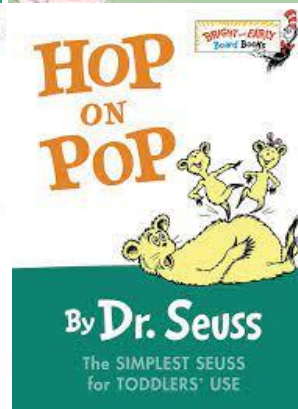
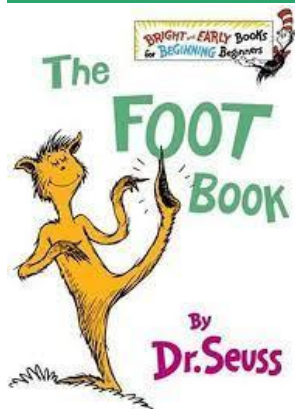
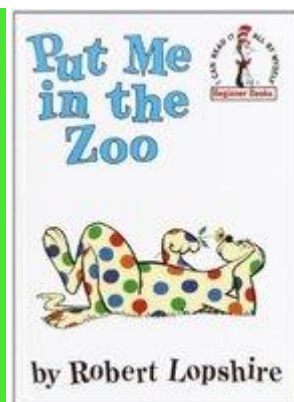
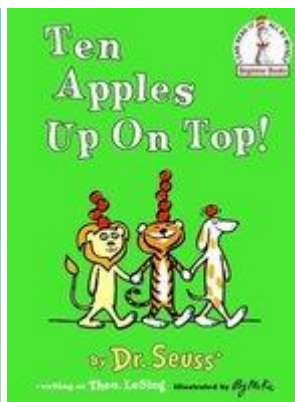
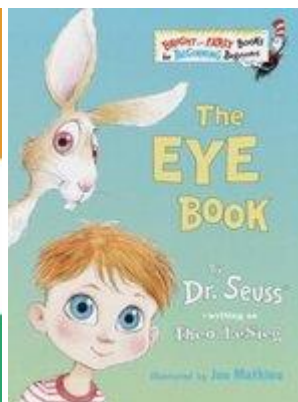
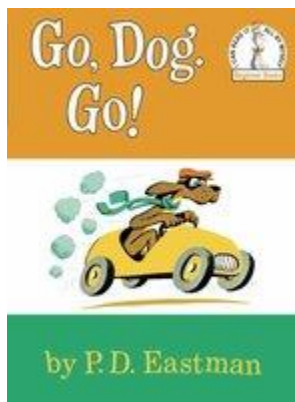
